

CURRICULUM

The majority of M.P.H. students complete the program in two years (full-time) or three to four years (part-time). An individual program plan is developed for each student based on education, experiences and career goals. The program can be completed on campus, online or as a hybrid.

An accelerated, full-time M.P.H. in Health Policy and Management hybrid program, designed to be completed in one year over three consecutive semesters is available only as a summer start.

ENHANCE YOUR DEGREE

The Division of Health Policy and Management at New York Medical College also offers certificates in global health and health administration. Earning an advanced certificate affords a focused-learning experience in a specific area.

Advanced Certificate in Global Health

This 12-credit online certificate offers the opportunity to explore health care issues that exist in developing countries and multi-ethnic populations in industrialized nations. Individuals working in health care can enhance their knowledge of health, socio-economic and political environments that affect health status of individuals and population groups. This certificate may be combined with an M.P.H. (using elective credits), or can be taken as a stand-alone certificate and applied to any M.P.H. program at a later date.
